Dear Mr. Eaton,

It was a disappointment to me that you were unable to see my secretary, Ralph Schoenman, during the time that he was in the United States.

We are at a point now with regard to the Foundation where we should like to make public its existence and its plans. We are, however, very much in need of support and it has been my hope that you would feel able to contribute in such a manner as to enable the Foundation to start vigorously and ambitiously. I hope that this is still possible, and I should also wish to ask whether you would feel able to grant us the use of a building in London such as you mentioned during your visit last September.

I think I should mention that the Foundation has now acquired tax exempt status in Great Britain and that, therefore, any contribution from Sterling holdings would qualify for this exemptibility. Naturally, I should be pleased and anxious to make public acknowledgement of your role and involvement in the work of the Foundation, unless you wished it otherwise.
