In one year, 50,000 air attacks were made by United States planes. In one year, 14,000 villages were destroyed. This brutal policy has done irreparable damage to the United States apart from the horrible suffering it has caused the people of Vietnam. The United States must be made to stop this war and to agree to the request of U Thant and of world opinion to negotiate now. The Geneva 14-nation Conference should be immediately convened after a cease-fire. I hope the United Nations/demand American agreement to a Conference such as that held in 1954 or condemn the United States as an aggressor. The alternative will be acquiescence in American extension of this war to the North, the involvement of China, and, quite inexorably, a world war. This must not be permitted. What worse can Goldwater do, if the men who claim to oppose him do so by outbidding him in madness and suicidal belligerence?

The American attacks on North Vietnam are a grave threat to world peace. They have no justification. The Seventh Fleet had ships off the North Vietnamese coast and North Vietnamese villages had been bombed by American planes flying from Laos. Today's Daily Mail reports that Pentagon sources reveal that American ships took part in the inspection of North Vietnamese ships on the North Vietnamese coast. The United States attacks reflect the disastrous consequences of United States policy in South East Asia. The war in South Vietnam is a popular national revolution which has a non-Communist leadership and massive national popular backing. The war is conducted despite the offer of all parties but the Americans to accept a neutral solution in accordance with the Geneva Conferences of 1954 and 1962. The war in South Vietnam has seen 7 million people placed in barbed-wire camps patrolled by machine gun bearing guards and police dogs. 160,000 have died, 700,000 have been maimed, 350,000 imprisoned and 16,000 internment camps constructed by the end of 1963.

The Atlantic Peace Foundation is a registered charity which works in co-operation with the Bertrand Russell Peace Foundation. Its objects are:

1. To establish international centres for the study of war and peace.  
The areas of research will include:
  - (a) Historical, political, economic, social, religious and racial influences in international conflicts;
  - (b) Historical, political, economic, social, religious, racial and cultural differences between societies engaged in or preparing for war;
  - (c) Problems of armament and disarmament; international tensions and their political, economic and social consequences;
  - (d) The effects of the cold war upon racial and religious minorities, such as Jewish families awaiting reunification, and upon individual victims of political differences.
2. To publish the results of research.  
By disseminating such information in the widest possible manner, the Foundation will seek to promote public interest in work conducted by the international centres.
3. To create other opportunities for research.  
These will include university chairs, scholarships and other bursaries.  
The Foundation is recognised as a charity by the Inland Revenue. Income tax at the standard rate is therefore recoverable on any subscription given under a seven-year covenant. This means that such subscriptions are increased by about 60 per cent.

The attached covenant form should be signed only by persons who are liable for income tax at the full standard rate on some part of their income. Stamp duty on the covenant will be paid by the Foundation. Each year a certificate of deduction of tax will be prepared and forwarded to the subscriber for his signature. Matters will be greatly facilitated by a banker's order for payments to be made directly by the subscriber's bank. The covenant arrangement becomes void in the event of the subscriber's death within the seven years. The signed Deed of Covenant and the banker's order form, if filled in, should be returned to the offices of the Foundation. The banker's order will be noted and forwarded to the subscriber's bank.



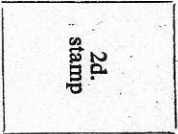

intends to place on a vast and institutional basis the efforts of Lord Russell to develop a movement of international resistance to the threat of nuclear war.

In recent years Lord Russell has been instrumental in helping to ease international crises and to create the conditions for their settlement.

He has sought to mobilise neutralist opinion on the side of international sanity.

He has assisted the development of popular resistance to nuclear war in dozens of countries.

He has aided hundreds of victims of the cold war and of arbitrary governments, both East and West.

He has made more widely known the facts about modern warfare.

This full-time work by Lord Russell is continuing and expanding rapidly. It is because of the great need and opportunity for specific achievements in all these fields that this Foundation has been established. Because of the number and scope of its specific projects, the Foundation will seek and welcome the participation of all those sympathetic to its aims.

The Cuban crisis, the Arab-Israeli dispute, conflict, the Sino-Indian border of central Europe — governments in conflict have welcomed or specifically sought Lord Russell's personal mediation because it has brought an impartial and effective voice to the exchange of proposals and counter-proposals.

Lord Russell is engaged in continual correspondence and contact with heads of neutral states all over the world. Many have accepted his view that neutralism provides one of the most promising means for resolving international tension, and have begun to act upon it.

Lord Russell is an international symbol of resistance to World War III. As such he has abandoned all his academic work for practical support of the international peace movement.

Political prisoners in many countries owe their release to Lord Russell's personal intervention on their behalf. The plight of others still imprisoned has been eased or made better known. Visas and similar assistance have been gained for other victims of political prejudice.

Despite the efforts of all the great powers to conceal the disastrous consequences of their policies, Lord Russell has played a major role through many books and through hundreds of articles and speeches in making known the realities of preparation for nuclear war.

A newspaper to publish news which elsewhere is suppressed or conveniently ignored, and to make known the work of the Foundation.

Printing and publishing facilities free from commercial and political pressures.

Documentary and other films which speak to the imagination about the realities of the nuclear age.

A radio station planned with a wide appeal, to serve as an international voice for nuclear disarmament, and with programmes developed in several languages.

Bertrand Russell House will be established in London to serve as administrative headquarters for the Foundation and as a centre for the international peace movement. Offices in different parts of the world will also be opened.

Spokesmen for the Foundation are travelling amongst groups active in the peace movement to expound its aims and to co-ordinate support. The Foundation's plans are ambitious and require the determined support of all concerned for human survival. They will not be achieved without vast financial backing. Whilst the funds being accumulated are necessarily large, no gift is too small.

The Secretary-General of the

It is good to know that it is proposed to start a  
 Foundation in the name of Lord Russell, to expand and  
 continue his efforts in the cause of peace.  
 Lord Russell was one of the first to perceive the  
 folly and danger of unlimited accumulation of nuclear  
 armaments. In the early years he conducted practically  
 a one-man crusade against this tendency and he now has a

 that the unrestricted manufacture, testing, perfecting,

 has conducted for so long and with such dedication will be  
 crowned with success.

a message from Bertrand Russell

We who have been working, day in and day out over a period of many years, against the threat of nuclear destruction have known the frustration of being without access to means of communicating our views or of systematically providing people with an alternative to the desperate policies pursued by governments. We have spoken, written, met and demonstrated. There are some of us, however, who do not feel that our efforts have measured up to the gravity of the situation; nor, despite the dedication of those who have joined in this work, have our efforts been co-ordinated internationally so that our numbers could be felt and our actions made effective.

The Peace Foundation, which comes into existence after lengthy and careful preparation, intends to organise on a scale never before attempted the establishment of our own media of mass communication for the furtherance of international work against nuclear war. We shall cease to depend on those paid by authority to lie on their behalf.

This effort and this undertaking can only succeed if it obtains the determined support of every individual sympathetic to the cause of immediate nuclear disarmament and of human survival. The cumulative result of such support can be overwhelming: the creation of a radio station capable of covering Western Europe, without any dependence upon those who market in human destruction.

This brochure sets out briefly the immediate work of the Foundation. We are preparing more detailed and elaborate literature reflecting the work of past months. I appeal to all in every country to support this work now.
