S Nobel Prize Winners Refused to Sign Appeal

LONDON, July 9 (AP)—Refusing to sign the nine scientists' appeal to renounce war were six Nobel Prize winners—Otto Hahn and Max Born of Germany, Niels Bohr of Denmark, Wolfgang Pauli of Switzerland, Karl Manne Siegbahn of Sweden and Lord Adrian of Britain.

Others who declined to sign were Dr. Homi J. Bhabha of India, president of the United Nations Atomic Energy Conference scheduled in Geneva Aug. 8-20; Soviet Academician Dimitry V. Skobel'tzyn, who has helped plan the conference, Prof. Alexander Hadow of Britain.

The appeal was ignored by two American Nobel Prize winners, Chancellor Ambur H. Compton of Washington University in St. Louis and Prof. Harold C. Urey of the University of Chicago.
