My Lord:

Soviet Premier Khrushchev has added his enthusiastic endorsement to the purposes and the documents of the Second Pugwash Conference of Nuclear Scientists, as you will see from the enclosed translation of the letter I have received from him.

Similar sentiments are also strongly expressed in the enclosed letter that President Tito of Yugoslavia sent me to forward to you, as well as in the accompanying facsimile of a letter that the Secretary General of Yugoslavia sent to me.

I would hope that Dr. Pavle S<sup>r</sup>avic might be invited to participate in the Third Pugwash Conference in Austria in September, as suggested by the Secretary General. One of the greatest scientists it has been my privilege to call friend during my long life time was the late Michael Pupin, a native of Yugoslavia. His brilliant achievements in the United States helped to acquaint the world with the scientific tradition of his native land and I, for one, would warmly welcome the opportunity to become acquainted with a present-day leader of Yugoslavian science.
