I know very little of them but I am wondering whether you mean a John MacQuarrie who emigrated in 1810 to N.S., and came from Rum, Argyleshire, lived at Scotch Hill until the age of 89 years where he died on 24 Jan 1860. Not likely the one you want, but worth mentioning I thought.

Also, you did not mention receiving my missive taken from a Prs. Witness re the man who visited Gairloch and vicinity in the late 1850's. If you did indeed receive it. what think??
