Kosygin Daughter Visits Eaton Northfield Farm

The capitalist and the Communist chatted here yesterday in the atmosphere of the farm and the social graces that sometimes are better on a farm than in the city. Topics of the chat were war and arms and the future of the race, the children and the grandchildren.

Cyrus S. Eaton was the capitalist, the capitalist if there ever was one, the man with 14 grandchildren, who with his wife, Anne Kinder Eaton, wish ardently for better relations between the United States and the U.S.S.R.

Mrs. Ludmilla Kosygin Gvishiani was the Communist, the daughter of Premier Alexei N. Kosygin of the Soviet Union, who has two children and no grandchildren, an historian with special interests in the history of American-Russian relations.

The premier's daughter and two Soviet scientists, Dr. Mikhail D. Millionshchikov, vice president of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, and his assistant, Igor Pochitalin, were weekend guests of the Eatons at Aca-dia Farms in Northfield.
